The launch of the new Ammerdown Interfaith Project by Christine Clinch

From London's Westminster Bridge to Parson's Green, this year has seen a significant increase in terrorist attacks. In their aftermath, hate crimes typically double. We cannot remain silent. 'Racism is a denial of the gospel and to stay silent when others are abused is to collude with those who seek to promote



hatred and division' (Methodist Conference 2016). The founders of the Ammerdown Centre set out to bring people from different backgrounds and faiths together so that they could learn from each other: striving for peace, social justice and reconciliation. Working within this context, the Ammerdown Interfaith Project sets out to challenge racism and discrimination.

Listening to the stories of the victims of hate crime; working together with people of different faiths and none; identifying current and possible projects in the Bristol and Bath area which successfully address hate crime; looking further afield in the UK at projects which could be transferred to the south west; the interfaith project sets out to develop a best practice template of projects that successfully address hate crime and make a difference. The project also hopes to strike up good relations with local MPs and to become an instrument of change in government policy, offering practical, tried and tested ways of addressing racism and discrimination.

As the newly appointed Interfaith Project Coordinator, I would love to hear from people who are passionate about addressing racial and faith related discrimination, victims of discrimination, those who are already working in this area and people with thoughts and ideas.
