

Such spaces seem to be in rather short supply in today's society - spaces which accept people just as they are, with open arms, without passing judgement or setting unrealistic expectations.

One of my great joys as Director of Ammerdown is to see people who feel 'different' blossom in the environment we provide. Here is what Jenny writes about taking part in our annual break specially tailored for M.E. sufferers:

"I am excited, my much anticipated holiday has just started, we are just going down Ammerdown's drive. As soon as you get out of the car, you are aware you are somewhere special, the serenity and calm just descend. It is a totally amazing feeling, and something I am at a loss to describe. Ammerdown has an air about it which needs to be experienced: it is beyond explanation!

For the last three years, attending the M.E. week at Ammerdown has been my one and only holiday (before Ammerdown started these holidays, I had no break at all!). I am able to rest, mentally and physically, but more importantly, 'completely'. The outside world disappears, and it is wonderful to be able to totally immerse myself in such a positive place, where I am not only physically cared for (I always put on rather a lot of weight each visit!) but



spiritually and emotionally. The opportunity to meet others with the same condition, with no explanation required, makes having M.E. more bearable. I am accepted as I am, there are no expectations and pressures. The activities are tailored for us and it is lovely to be able to have fun with others. This is hugely important as M.E. is a very isolating illness. The companionship in a home away from home is 'just what the doctor ordered'.

I can only afford the holiday, though, because Ammerdown gives me a generous bursary. I know that, as financial supporters, you help make it possible. I want you all to know that it is money very well spent. My annual break at Ammerdown quite simply helps keep me going. Thank You!"

Hospitality is not to change people, but to offer a space where change can take place. ... It is not a method of making our God and our way into the criteria of happiness, but the opening to others to find their God and their way." This is precisely the type of hospitality that we aim to provide at Ammerdown. It is good to read that our guests feel we are getting it right!

Ammerdown helps launch local Foodbank

Although Ammerdown welcomes guests from all over the UK and further afield, it also has a local ministry. For example, we arrange regular 'Pampering Days for Carers' for the exclusive benefit of local carers. We also have our own 'TLC' Club for elderly people in the local community



looking for fellowship. This is all very worthwhile work, but we could not help feeling that there was more that we could and should do. We were therefore delighted when the opportunity arose for Ammerdown to be involved in setting up a Foodbank for the local area - a wonderful project that brings local churches and charities together to help people in crisis. The aim is to provide emergency food to families who have hit desperate times and have no money left for food, and also to get professional agencies involved for longer term help.

So, after months of work behind the scenes, the 'Somer Valley Foodbank' was officially launched on 8 January, with Ammerdown providing free administrative back-up and telephone service. These are very exciting times indeed... (For more information about Foodbanks, visit www.trusselltrust.org)
