#6 - Our vocation is characterized

by the the Word of God

which is central in our lives.

Through his Word,

God reveals his name and his will

for the redemption of the world.

The Spirit enables us to discover the link

between the concrete events of life and this Word:

events make the Scriptures come alive for us,

and the Scriptures reveal the significance

of events and human existence.

We are called

to keep this Word in our hearts,

to meditate on it, to study it,

to share it, and to act on it.

#7 - The revelation of the Word of God

in the Old Testament

is the common root of Judaism and Christianity.

In the Church,

we interpret the Scriptures

in the light of the Christ event.

We are also attentive to the way

the Bible is interpreted by Jewish people

in their life and tradition.

We thereby grow

in the appreciation of our own roots

and in an understanding of Judaism.

We are called to foster

this appreciation and understanding in the Church.

#35 - The Bible recounts

the experience of a liberated people to whom God, through the prophets, entrusted the cause of the poor.

#49 - The Word of God

reflected on and shared together

calls us to conversion.

This Word enables us

to discern the presence and action of God

in persons and events.

#55 - The Word of God is a living spring;

it is nourishment, support and the light of life.

like Mary,

we become able to discover God's loving presence
