#3 - The charism given to Fr. Theodore
is a continuing gift of God for the Church.
In the light of the ecumenical movement and
of the signs of the times,
especially the experiences of the Jewish people,
the Church, reflecting on her own origin and mission,
has rediscovered her roots
in God's revelation to Israel.
At the same time, a new relationship is developing
between the Church and the Jewish community.
At the heart of this movement in the Church,
the Congregation
grows in understanding its vocation and
responds in a new way to the founder's inspiration.

#13 - This call implies

that our apostolic life is characterized by a three-fold commitment: to the Church, to the Jewish people, and to a world of justice, peace and love. In whatever task we are engaged in, we are called to integrate in some way, these three dimensions of our apostolic commitment.

- #15.2 Through various forms of catechetics and pastoral work we contribute to the building of the ecclesial community. This work is an important means:
 - of deepening an awareness within the Church of the Jewish roots of Christianity;
 - of encouraging an understanding of post-biblical history, of the tradition and present reality of the Jewish people;
 - of counteracting the anti-Semitism among Christians, which has damaged the presentation of the gospel message, diminished the credibility of the Church, and become a source of anguish for the Jews.
